OSHA Reporting Policy

Purpose

The updated reporting requirements are not simply paperwork but have a life-saving purpose: It will help staff prevent future injuries by identifying and eliminating the most serious workplace hazards.

Beginning January 1, 2015, covered employers are required to report to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration all workplace fatalities, inpatient hospitalizations, amputations, and loss of an eye(s) within specified time frame as listed below:
